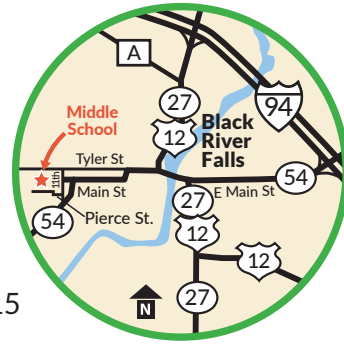

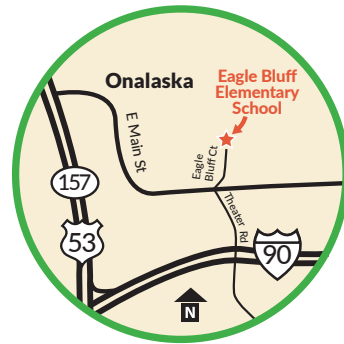

### SESSION 1

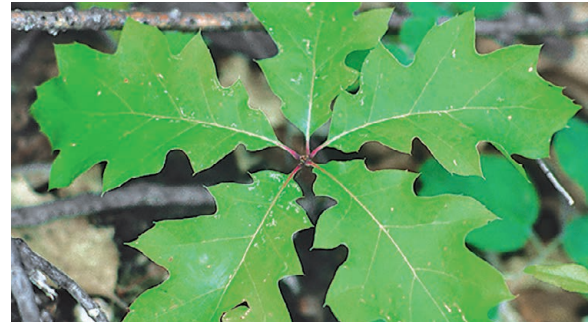
## PEOPLE AND PROGRAMS: ASSISTANCE WITH YOUR WOODLANDS
